Grammar- Perfect Verb Tense

- A verb tense tells when the action or state of being takes place.
- ► Each of the perfect tenses describes an action or a state of being that was or will be completed at a certain time.
- Perfect tenses are formed by adding a form of the helping verb have (has/have) to the past participle of the main verb, which in regular verbs ends in ed.
 - Examples:
 - ▶ Beverly has wanted to be a singer for years.
 - ▶ By tomorrow, Andy will have walked home with Beth every day this week.

Grammar- Perfect Verb Tense

- ► The present perfect tense shows a past action or condition that continues into the present.
 - Example: The gas gauge <u>has indicated</u> an empty tank for some time now.
- The past perfect tense shows a past action or condition that was completed before another began.
 - Example: Dad <u>had filled</u> the tank before we started our vacation.
- The future perfect tense shows a future action or condition that will have ended at a certain time.
 - Example: By this time next week, our trip will have ended.

Grammar Review- Subjunctive Verb Mood

- Indicative Mood- used for a statement of fact
 - Jorge is going to the store.
 - I am at home.
 - Sam goes to the store.
 - They were quiet.
- Subjunctive Mood- used to express a wish, a hope, a request, or a statement contrary to fact.
 - ▶ I wish that Sam were going, too.
 - ▶ If I were at home, I would eat.
 - ▶ I insist that Sam **go** to the store.
 - We asked that they be quiet.

Grammar Review- Subjunctive Verb Mood

Rules for Forming the Subjunctive Mood

For that clauses, generally use the base form of the verb, regardless of the subject.	I demand that she speak on the record. Mom asked that he spend less time online
For be (as a main or helping verb), use the base form, be , in most that clauses, regardless of the subject. In that clauses after the verb wish, however, use were	We prefer that she appear in person. I insisted that Megan be quiet. I suggest (that) he be granted immunity. I wish (that) she were mayor.
For be, use were in present-tense if clauses, regardless of the subject.	If Lou were mayor, he would change the law. If it were stopped, I would be happy

Essay requirements on the test

- Write at least 3 paragraphs- Introduction, Body, Conclusion
- You need at least 5 or more sentences in each paragraph.
- Option 1: "Always to Remember" is an essay about the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. It also includes photographs of the memorial and of Maya Lin. In an essay, explain whether the text and pictures together give you enough information to understand why the Vietnam Veterans Memorial is considered to be such a moving monument to the soldiers who lost their lives in Vietnam. In your essay, use details from "Always to Remember" to explain why the memorial is moving, or describe what additional information might help you better understand the memorial's impact. (16 points)
- ▶ Option 2: Both "Forest Fire" and "Why Leaves Turn Color in the Fall" present factual information. Write an essay of your own about one of those essays. In your essay, tell whether the author provided enough information for you to understand the topic fully. Then discuss how the method of organization of the essay you are writing about affected your understanding of the topic. If you think additional information would have helped you understand the topic better, describe the information that is lacking and explain how it could have helped you. (16 points)

How to write and organize your essay:

Option 1:

- Introduction- In this essay, I will describe the "Always To Remember" passage, and discuss whether or not the author uses enough text and pictures to describe its significance. This essay discusses.....
- ▶ Body- use details from the essay to explain your opinion
- Conclusion- In conclusion, this essay discussed the Always To Remember passage, describing the significance of the Vietnam War Memorial. I agree/disagree that the essay had enough information because....

Option 2

- Introduction- For this essay, I will be describing "Forest Fire/Why Leaves Turn Color in the Fall." I will be discussing whether the essay provided enough details for me to understand the topic. In my opinion, the essay did/did not provide enough information because...
- ▶ Body- use details from the essay to explain your opinion about the organizational mode used in the essay (Forest Fire- chronological, Why Leaves Turn Color in the Fall- cause and effect)
- Conclusion- In conclusion, this essay discussed the information provided in "Forest Fire/Why Leaves Turn color in the Fall." I believe that this selection did/did not provide enough information because...
